Toyota Tacoma 2016 Contour Canopy Fitment Instructions

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1. Canopy Fitment – Tools, Fasteners & Materials

The tables below show the equipment, i.e. tools and fasteners required to start the canopy fitment for a Toyota Tacoma.

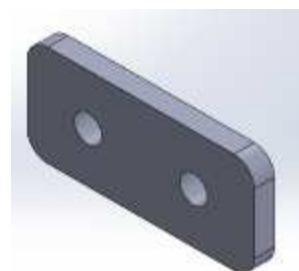
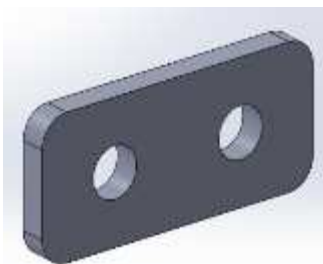
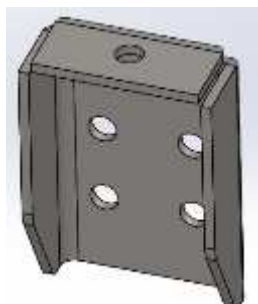
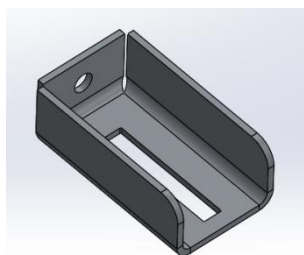


Fig 1: TT-TOP-MNT-BRKT-01-00

2. Mounting the canopy brackets to the load bin

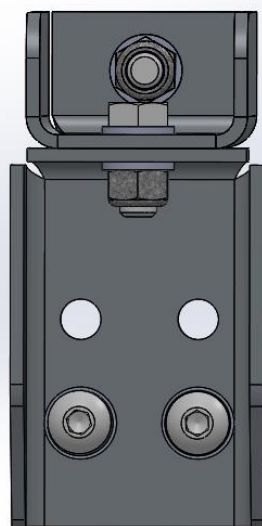
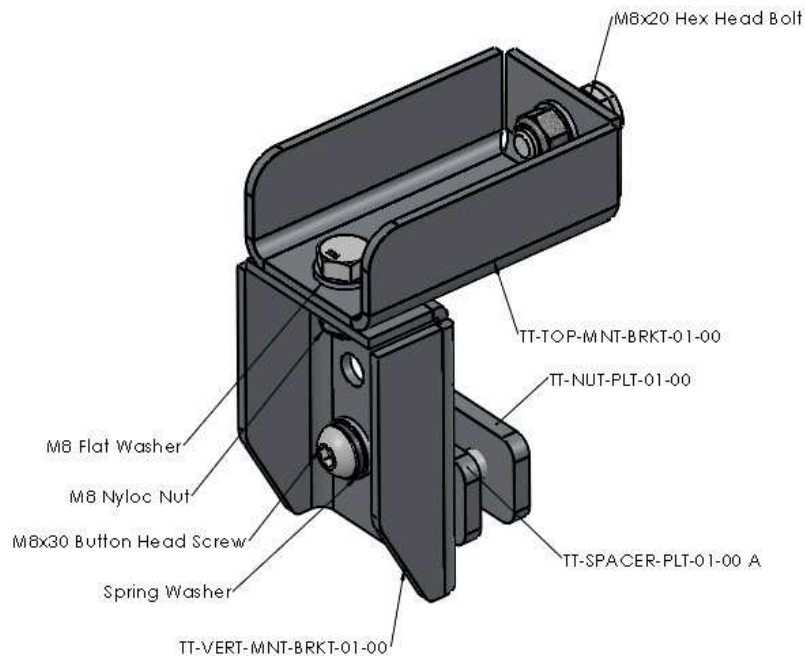


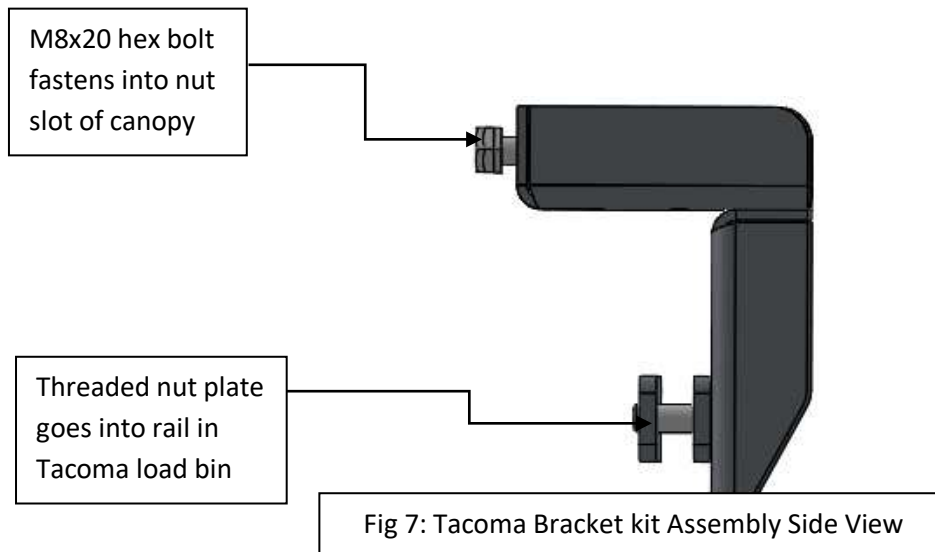
Fig 6: Tacoma Bracket kit Assembly Front View

The Tacoma canopy has six bracket kits (3 per side) which are fitted to the load bin. Figure 5 and 6 below shows a bracket kit assembly.

2.1. Mounting the Support Brackets to the Load Bin

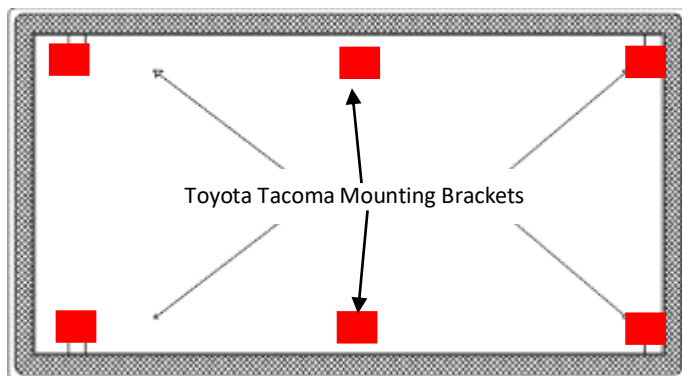


Fig 8: Top View of Load bin

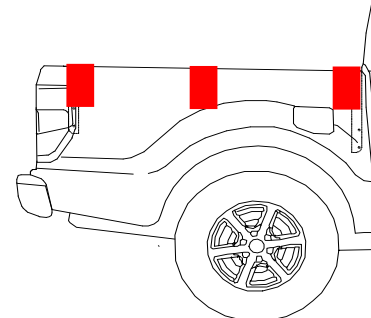


Fig 9: Side View of Load bin

Figures 8 and 9 shows where the mounting brackets are fixed to the load bin.

Bolting the brackets to the load bin

For each bracket assembly, first slide the threaded nut plate into the Toyota Tacoma load bin rail. TT-SPACER-PLT-01-00 will be sandwiched between TT-VERT-MNT-BRKT-01-00 and the load bin rail as a spacer if needed. TT-VERT-MNT-BRKT-01-00 will be bolted to the thread nut plate using the M8x30 Button head screws with M8 flat washers and M8 spring washers.

Bolting the brackets to the Canopy

TT-TOP-MNT-BRKT-01-00 bolts to the nut slot in the canopy frame. Slide the provided M8x20 hex bolts into the frame by using the drilled out access holes. Roughly position the TT-TOP-MNT-BRKT-01-00 in the same position indicated in figure 8. Once the brackets are in position fasten them down with a flat washer and nylock nut.

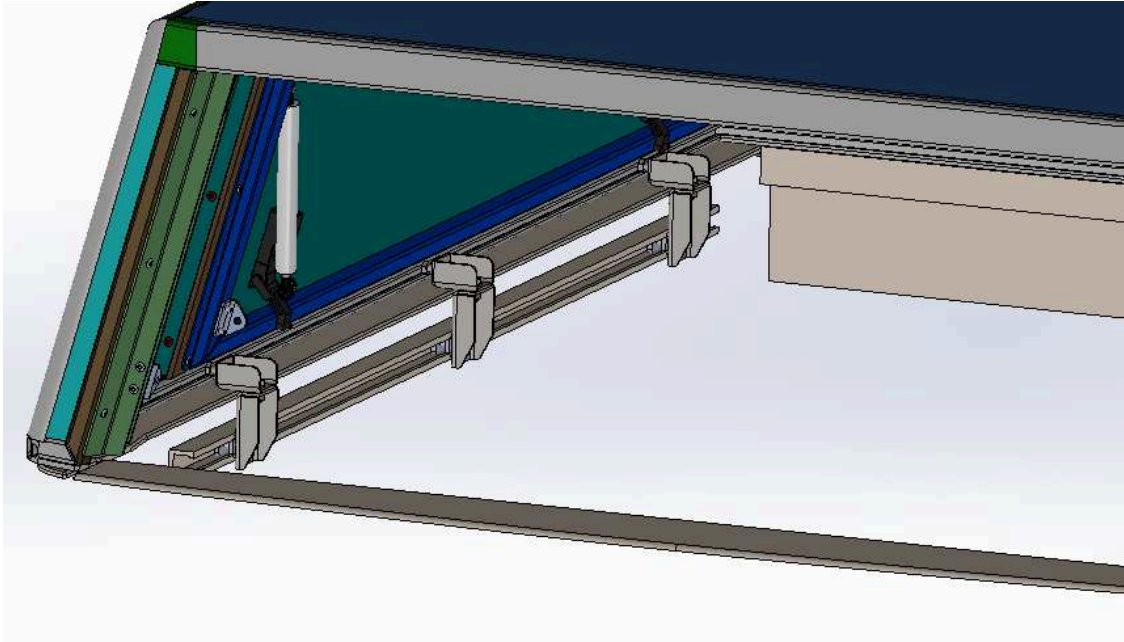


Fig 10: Tacoma Bracket kits

3. Sealing the Front Bulkhead Spacer

In the 2016 and later models of the Tacoma a front bulkhead spacer bracket is included as a stock item.



The bulkhead spacer bracket pictured above does not seal on to the load bin when it comes from the factory. To remedy this butyl tape (3M window weld) can be used. The butyl tape is applied to the gaps indicated above, apply it as a putty and ensure that a large amount is used to ensure the best seal possible.

4. Canopy Installation

Before placing the canopy onto the load bin, check that the D-Rubber is intact on the canopy. If this is not done, the canopy and/or load bin could be damaged or can cause leaks into the canopy.

To position the canopy, ensure that it is flush with the load bin on the inside.

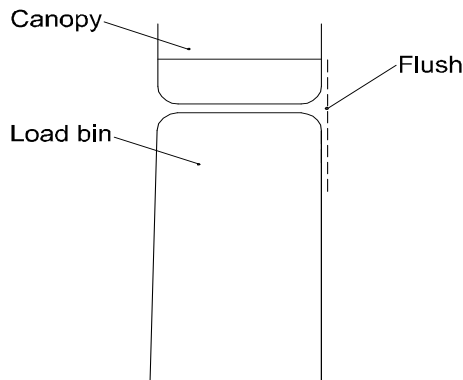


Figure 13: Canopy and Load Bin Alignment

4.1. Canopy Fitment to Load bin

Keep all the doors of the canopy open besides the rear door when placing it onto the load bin. With the TT-TOP-MNT-BRKT-01-00 affixed to the canopy and the TT-VERT-MNT-BRKT-01-00 affixed to the load bin place the canopy on to the load bin. If there are any gaps between the TT-TOP-MNT-BRKT-01-00 and the TT-VERT-MNT-BRKT-01-00 fill the gap with shims. With the shims in place raise the rear of the canopy slightly, approximately 10mm, add another two or three shims to the rear mount brackets and drop the canopy into position again. The mount brackets will now fully support the canopy weight.

Check the distance between the rear door lip seal and the load bin, the distance should be approximately 5mm to ensure the rubber does not tear but still seals.

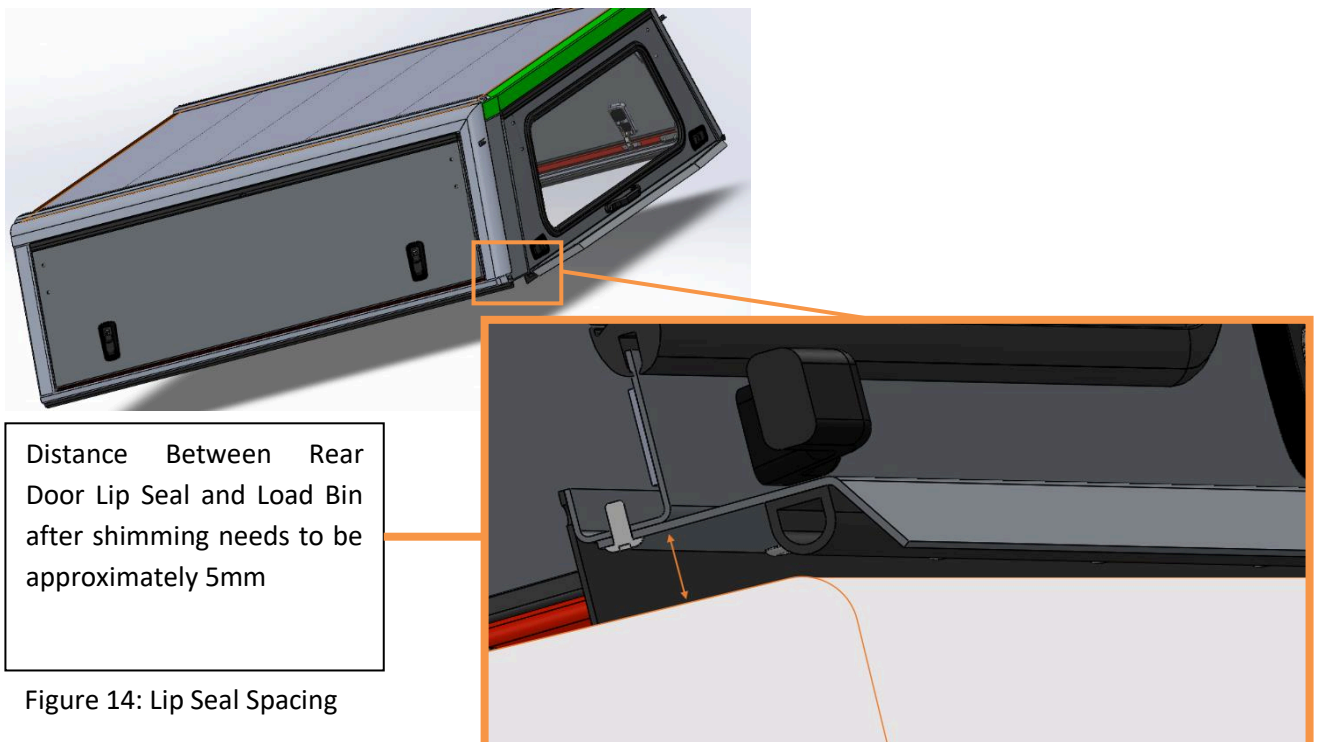


Figure 14: Lip Seal Spacing

Work forward from the rear brackets and shim up the mounting brackets where required to ensure an even compression of the D-rubber on the bottom of the canopy frame. With the rubber evenly compressed fasten the TT-TOP-MNT-BRKT-01-00 and the TT-VERT-MNT-BRKT-01-00 to each other using a M8x20mm Hex Bolt, two M8 Flat Washer and a M8 Nylock Nut. The canopy is now secure

4.2. Windowweld on Fitted Canopy

With the Canopy fitted reinspect the windowweld and ensure all gaps are properly closed.

The finished Canopy should look like figures 15 and 16 below.
